ICD-10 Coding Tip

Root Operation - Change

In an effort to aid Health Information Management Coding and Medical Billing Professionals with ICD-10, the following training tip is provided with an educational intent.

Definition: Taking out [or off] a device from a body part and putting back an identical or similar device in [or on] the same body part without cutting or puncturing the skin or a mucous membrane.

Explanation: All CHANGE procedures are coded using the approach external.

Examples: Urinary catheter change, gastrostomy tube change, tracheostomy tube exchange, and exchange of ventriculostomy drainage tube.

External: The definition for the External approach provided in the 2014 ICD-10 PCS Manual is "Procedures performed indirectly on the skin or mucous membrane and procedures performed indirectly by the application of external force through the skin or mucous membrane."

Objective: To exchange a similar device without making a new incision or puncture.

Tip: One of the key components of the root operation of change is that the procedure will always involve a device.
