

## **ICD-10 Coding Tip**

## **Underdosing**

In an effort to aid Health Information Management Coding Professionals with ICD-10, the following coding tip is provided with an educational intent.

Underdosing is defined as taking less of a medication than is prescribed by the provider or the manufacturer's instructions. Underdosing is identified by the number "6" in the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> character of an ICD-10 CM code.

Example: Coumadin underdosing, initial encounter - T45.516A Underdosing of unspecified psychotropic drug - T43.96xA

## Sequencing of codes for underdosing

- Do not assign Underdosing code as principal or first listed code
- > Assign code for relapse or exacerbation of medical condition for which the medication is prescribed as the principal or first listed code
- > Assign the code for the underdosing as an additional code
- > Assign an additional code for noncompliance, if known
- > Assign an additional code for complication of care, if known
